They provide outreach services for the City of Redlands, City of Highland, and the Central Valley. They provide Enhances Case Management (ECM) - a medical program which connects them to medical services and support for those needed to be permanently housed. They provide community support, integration, housing navigation, with first month rent and case management. • US Vets – Inland Empire – Desiree Rivera – Case Manager II – Eduardo – Coordinator US Vets – IE is location in the City of Colton and services the entire counties of San Bernardino and Riverside. The targeted population is Veterans. How they serve is with the Housing - Bridge Program – Emergency Shelter, Rapid Re-Housing, and Permanent Supportive Housing (PHS). Can assist with up to 2 months of rental and landlord assistance. The ask was to use funds allotted for operations to be used for pre-development and construction cost for the new HOPE Navigation and Recuperative Care Center. The board approved the request with a timeline amendment and prior review from the Central Valley. • HHAP 4 remaining contracts will be presented at the BOE February 24th meeting. • HHAP 5 RFA will be released towards the end of the first quarter 2025. • Treasure Ortiz – City of San Bernardino – Moving ahead with the Navigation Center and anticipating a groundbreaking ceremony by year end. Partnering with Salvation Army with this endeavor. Looking into a partnership with Jamboree Housing Corp. to develop up to 150 affordable units in the City of San Bernardino. • Jeff Allen – City of Grand Terrace – Had a power outage and the city quickly established their community center as an emergency shelter for those affected. <p>E. Presentation – City of Redlands - David Rabindranath/Melissa Sanchez</p>	<p>The Homeless Solutions Department for the City of Redlands was established three years ago. To better understand the needs of the new department the Redlands GIS Team did a ride along with the Outreach Team to see how they could help build systems so they could support the new department’s endeavors. Recognizing the need for quick access to resources for the homeless, the GIS team went to work to coordinate all the resources/service providers in the city and region along with the Redlands Charitable Resources Coalition, a local group of nonprofits that work with low income and homeless in Redlands. They created the “little blue book” resource guide and the city partners with them monetarily to print the book. This has been a 15-year partnership.</p> <p>To enhance the usage of the “little blue book” Melissa, from the GIS team created a resource app for the City of Redlands. GIS is a system that creates management, analyzes and maps all types of data. It is a tool that helps visualize data using geographic coordinates. GIS solutions provide data and transparency to the public. They can identify patterns, trends and relationships. They help the city function and serve the public with the most up to date data. CityGeo Hub is on the City of Redlands webpage under Homeless solutions. The Geohub app provides local resources like directions to resources, cooling centers, recycle centers, job programs, food distribution, clothing, educational programs, legal serves, medical and dental services within the City of Redlands. Stakeholders like the public, homeless solution team, police, or city manager’s office have access and use this app which can be accessed by phone or desktop as well. The Outreach team can use this when they are out in the field to find the quickest resource. GIS has helped a lot with the point in time count,</p>

identifying hotspot and quickly identifying services that are most needed. You can access the QR code on the website. A lot of resources for San Bernardino are listed and located in the app as well.

Claudia, the Program Specialist with the Office of Homeless Services, gave the following updates:

The Office of Homeless Services has established a new email and will be sending from this new email, announcements, meeting notices, events and general information. OHS@HSS.SBcounty.Gov

The old email will not be going away but will be specifically meant for funding opportunities and RFP’s applications and contracts developed. A Data dashboard will show all the funds that are available in the county and will track spending and other things as well. The San Bernardino County website will remain online with new updated version.

On December 3, 2024, 8 out of 15 contracts of HHAP 4 funding were approved by the BOS. On February 25th an additional 5 contracts were approved, and disbursements will follow shortly.

The remaining HAPP 4 awards (for 2 providers) still need BOS approval.

Ruben Mendoza reported that the CoC Board Meetings will be held every other month. This change will allow for the CoC Full Membership meetings to be scheduled in the gap months. The first CoC Full Membership meeting is scheduled for March 26th at 9a at Water of Life Community Church. The next CoC Board Meeting will be April 23rd 9a-11a. On February 27th, the CES/Outreach Committee voted on a new Chair - Willam Llamas from Victorville and Vice-Chair – David Rabindranath as leads for the committee.

Lutheran Social Ujima Moore – Case Manager

Lutheran Social Services is located at 1354 N. G St. LLS has a men’s shelter for men 18 and over. The clients work with a case manager who ensures that all necessary supportive services needed to stabilize the client are accessed.

Meals, showers, and transportation are some of the services provided as well as storage (tote) for belongs and animal kennel if needed. resources. Beds are assigned for those who are HIV positive or living with AIDS and is a HUD funded criteria for chronically homeless.

Seniors also prefer hard copy.</p> <p>4. Pastor Paul Jones – Can our CV providers add additional resources to the app?</p> <p>Currently, the IT department supervises the app for all the City of Redlands and the staff does not have the capacity of do outside requests.</p>
