

Agency Allocation vs Expenditure



Agency Allocation vs Expenditure



Agency Allocation vs Expenditure



Approve the allocation of 5% of HHAP-5 funding from the Central Regional allocation to support system infrastructure for the Coordinated Entry System (CES), specifically to sustain and strengthen the regional HUBs.

Report:

Regional Co-Chairs were contacted by the Office of Homeless Services requesting consideration for allocation of funding towards CES functions. Copy of the email is included here:

Good afternoon RSC Regional Co-Chairs,

As part of the HHAP 5 RFP planning process, our office respectfully requests that each region consider setting aside 5% of its total regional allocation to support system infrastructure for the Coordinated Entry System (CES), specifically to sustain and strengthen the regional HUBs.

The regional HUBs play a critical role within each region by providing standardized assessment, rapid rehousing support, and coordinated resource navigation tailored to local needs. HUBs conduct intake, complete housing assessments (including tools such as the VI-SPDAT), provide homelessness problem-solving assistance, and connect individuals and families to emergency, interim, and permanent housing resources. They serve as centralized access points that bring providers together, streamline service delivery, and ensure that the most vulnerable individuals are prioritized for housing interventions.

Dedicated system support funding would help maintain consistency, efficiency, and equity across the CES structure while reinforcing each region's capacity to respond effectively to homelessness.
