Mark Nuaimi	The Chair opened the ITEM # G The Chair reported one confirmed public-agency vacancy and a second anticipated vacancy because appointed probation representatives were not attending. Two individuals had expressed interest: Tyrese Crawford and Prince. Tyrese introduced herself as a homeless-education program coordinator and described her professional and lived experience with youth homelessness and McKinney-Vento services. Motion: A motion was made and seconded to select Tyrese Crawford for the public-agency seat. Vote: The motion was approved by a majority show of hands in the Central Valley Region Meeting. Outcome: Tyrese Crawford was selected to fill the public-agency vacancy.
H. Receive recommendations for the Summer / Fall presentations schedule.	Mark Nuaimi	August 5: Operation Grace requested to present on HHAP-3. One additional presentation slot remained available. September 2: Citylink volunteered to present, 1 presentation slots remained available. October: Inland Housing Solutions tentatively volunteered to present on HHAP-4 and HHAP-

		5, subject to contract timing. 1 presentation slots remained available. Ongoing schedule: The Committee intends to invite each of the eight HHAP-5-funded agencies to present over the next several months. City presentations: Fontana, Redlands, San Bernardino, Colton, and other public agencies were invited to present local homelessness plans, projects, and updates.

Individual Committee Member Comments	Mark Nuaimi	Zazette Scott - The co-chair stated that she intends to step down as co-chair after the vacant public-agency representative seat is filled so that co-chair representation can return to one public entity and one nonprofit representative. She offered to continue assisting with HPN presentations, workshops, speakers, and regional coordination. City of Colton- A family headed by a single mother was permanently housed. Free breakfast and lunch were being offered to children at the Gonzales Community Center park and Veterans Park while summer school remained in session. The City was developing a partnership with a Rancho Cucamonga-area organization funded by Molina, Kaiser, and another health-related grant to provide free or low-cost workshops focused on foster youth, domestic violence, anger management, and teens. Additional details will be shared when the fall schedule is available. 211 - Case conferencing was scheduled for June 25 Inland Housing Solutions - Seven households had been housed, including six referrals from the Central Valley. Fifteen households were actively searching for housing. Affordability remained a primary barrier, particularly for seniors. Exploring master leasing, shared housing, and co-living options. The program has availability for families with children who meet HUD's literal-homelessness definition and requested coordinated-entry referrals, with a goal of approximately six families per month for the next three months. Staff offered to help families navigate coordinated entry and encouraged outreach and CES teams to attend the upcoming virtual meeting. City of Grand Terrace– No update City of Redlands - The City reported implementing a new Proposition 47 grant. The City continued supporting clients and housing providers. A new partnership was being developed with to provide financial counseling to households at risk of homelessness.

		City of Fontana - The City's advisory council was engaging nonprofits and business owners to develop a landlord-engagement approach and identify potential rental opportunities. Rivers Edge Ranch was selected to provide opioid-settlement-funded services, including street outreach, substance-use and opioid-resource connections, referrals, mental-health and co-occurring-disorder support, and a support line. The City promoted its lead-hazard reduction program for qualifying pre-1978 housing and invited landlords and property owners to contact the Housing Department for eligibility screening. City link - Introduced a recap video from a recent Shelter Court event held at the campus in partnership with San Bernardino County Superior Court, probation, and other County offices. The event connected participants to court and record-clearing services and other resources.
