J. Committee Member Updates/Comments

City of Redlands - No Comments

Probation - There will be an upcoming shelter court in February more information will be told shortly. The HOPE TEAM might not be on the board because they have spilt up the deputies to different stations. This might be temporary not permanent.

Water Of Life/CityLink –Completed their first year of the springs 20 trailers of transitional housing. Over the year they had over 121 individuals housed. 37 households 74 total kids. Out of the 37 households 16 have moved on. 75% transitioned to permanent housing. Grateful for the partnerships with church, the city of Fontana and San Bernardino County.

Inland Housing Solutions- Received the HHAP 4 contact. Which means they will be providing permanent housing for seniors. 55 and over for Central Valley East Valley and West Valley. Setting everything up in HMIS encouraging everyone if they have clients that are homeless through the CES system because that is the only way they are receiving referrals. Also received the Path Cited grant are expanding their team. Hired 80 people starting next week. Will be hiring again in the next 3 months for the second round of hiring. Housed 2 seniors in central Valley before the holidays.

Benjamin E Jones CRC –No comments

City of Fontana –62 kids received a great Christmas and families were housed. 10 individuals have moved to permanent housing from the path. Housed over 150 from the past year. City Council approved 4 new positions with public works department last year in July part time. Out of the 4 positions they filled 2 about a month ago. Providing jobs for those who are unemployed as well. Are being transparent on their website the public knows where their money is going and being spent. Partnership with The Riverside Ranch has been phenomenal. The city bought a triplex that they're going to dedicate to affordable housing units first come first serve. This program is for Male drug rehabilitation it is very intense living on a ranch for a year. Hoping to get another motel to convert into studio apartments for midterm permanent housing, 60 units for at risk homeless or homeless.

Family Assistance Program – The California interagency Council on Homelessness released their Action plan it's a huge lift. They have action plan goals and are using local response to homelessness it will be there north star .For every 5 individuals who access homelessness services in California only 1 is only able to access permanent housing. Leaving a gap of 4 people to experience homelessness. They are hoping to reduce that gap. For every 5 people served 3 people are placed in housing. Thanked the Board for letting her be a Co-Chair.

City of San Bernardino - Approved the U.s vet project. Outreach staff and Salvation Army. has been doing a great job. For the month of December the staff has contacted 261 individuals 171 successful engagements total active enrollment 80. 145 referrals.

U.S Vets -Are very excited for the U.S Vet Project can't wait to get it filled up.

LEGAL AUTHORITY

AB 210 / WIC 18999.8

- Chaptered Oct. 7, 2017 — Chapter 544, Statutes of 2017
- Authorizes counties to form MDTs to expedite identification, assessment, and linkage to housing/supportive services, and permits participating agencies to share confidential info under California law to coordinate care.

AB 728 / WIC 18999.81

- Chaptered Sept. 26, 2019 — Chapter 337, Statutes of 2019
- Adds explicit focus on people at risk of homelessness and prevention.

Assembly Bill No. 210

CHAPTER 544

An act to add Chapter 18 (commencing with Section 18999.8) to Part 6 of Division 9 of the Welfare and Institutions Code, relating to public social services.

[Approved by Governor October 7, 2017. Filed with Secretary of State October 7, 2017.]

LEGISLATIVE COUNSEL'S DIGEST

AB 210, Santiago. Homeless multidisciplinary personnel team. Existing law authorizes counties to establish a child abuse multidisciplinary personnel team, as defined, to allow provider agencies to share confidential information in order to investigate reports of suspected child abuse or neglect or for the purpose of child welfare agencies making detention determinations, as specified.

This bill would authorize counties to also establish a homeless adult and family multidisciplinary personnel team, as defined, with the goal of facilitating the expedited identification, assessment, and linkage of homeless individuals to housing and supportive services within that county and to allow provider agencies to share confidential information, as specified, for the purpose of coordinating housing and supportive services to ensure continuity of care. The bill would require the sharing of information permitted under these provisions to be governed by protocols developed in each county, as specified, and would require each county to provide a copy of its protocols to the State Department of Social Services.

This bill would authorize the homeless adult and family multidisciplinary personnel team to designate qualified persons to be a member of the team for a particular case and would require every member who receives information or records regarding adults and families in his or her capacity as a member of the team to be under the same privacy and confidentiality obligations and subject to the same confidentiality penalties as the person disclosing or providing the information or records. The bill would also require the information or records to be maintained in a manner that ensures the maximum protection of privacy and confidentiality rights.

The people of the State of California do enact as follows:

SECTION 1. Chapter 18 (commencing with Section 18999.8) is added to Part 6 of Division 9 of the Welfare and Institutions Code, to read:

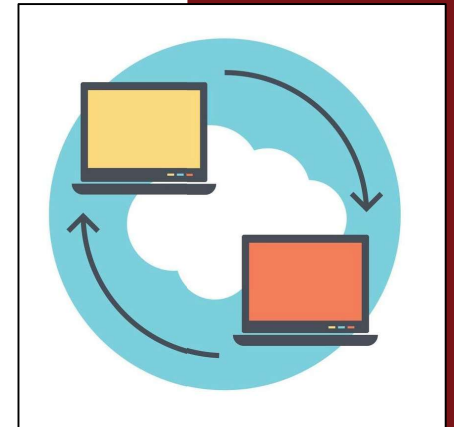


INFORMATION SHARING

What can be shared

- Confidential info under California law may be exchanged if reasonably believed relevant to reducing/eliminating homelessness or providing services
- Law enforcement use is limited to identification/assistance/ linkage (not enforcement purposes).

Shared information must be purpose-limited, compliant, and protected.





HOMELESSNESS MDT

- The County Administrative Office established the Homeless Multidisciplinary Team (MDT) in February 2025.
- Strategic Planning Session to identify Desired Outcomes
- On August 13, 2025, 13 County departments signed a Participating Agency Agreement showing the County's commitment to leveraging data and cross-departmental collaboration to improve outcomes for our most vulnerable residents.
