Asked agencies to review their budget in light of programs that are being cut or unfunded in the current administration. Many agencies have already been affected and will need to diversify their revenue streams to stay sustainable. Cuts will affect services in the San Bernardino County, and we need to be diligent to implement a strategy to meet the needs of the communities we serve. • Call to Action: Mr. Lewis asked community members to act and advocate for your funding by writing supporting letters to their congressmen and elected officials to express concerns with the state of the budget. Programs that stabilize and support sustainability must be fought for to move the needle in solving the homeless problem in our regions. Urged us to notify them about the concerns jeopardizing program funding and what the lack of resources/programs for our client base would mean.

Office of Homeless Services Updates – None	Supervisor M.Bolar- with the San Bernardino Probation department. Our mission is to build stronger families and safer communities. By improving our lives, we serve through assessment treatment, rehabilitative services and enforcement. Each unit comes up with them owe purpose statement. Housing unit provides an avenue in the direction of self-sufficiency for those experiencing homelessness. The focus is to assist the individual and one becoming self-sustaining. Which could improve family relationships and reduce recidivism. It’s our duty to preserve community safety and make great efforts to rehabilitate offenders. These standards can be accomplished by bridging the gap from custody to community through linkage to service. Probation officers assess what they do every day. Probation Officer III L. Amaya- Housing 3 different day Reporting Centers Fontana San Bernardino and one in Victor Ville. Business hours 8am-5pm. Works in a first come first serve base. The earlier they get there the better to receive services. There is a housing officer in each facility. Referral are received by clients themselves walk-in’s their case agent can refer them after they come in from their screening from the orientation and assessment when they’re released from custody. A lot of questions are asked if they have mental health history, history of substance medical history if they have health issues last time, they see a nurse or visited a doctor look their criminal history and their ability to work. We are transitional housing and do require them to work. Probation housing is only 365 days.
