Dear Mr. Velasquez:

On behalf of the San Bernardino County Continuum of Care (CoC), administered through the San Bernardino County Homeless Partnership, please accept this letter of support for the City of Ontario's application to obtain Encampment Resolution Funding (ERF) Round 5 from the California Department of Housing and Community Development (HCD). The City is proposing to prioritize a freeway-adjacent encampment zone on State Route 60 between Euclid Avenue and Archibald Avenue. The City's plan includes motel-based interim housing, dedicated outreach and case management teams, street medicine and clinical linkage through CalAIM Enhanced Care Management (ECM), and permanent housing placement through the Coordinated Entry System (CES).

The ERF project will support cross-systems collaboration and service strategies to help people experiencing homelessness transition out of encampments toward safe and stable housing pathways, with priority directed toward protecting the health, safety, and well-being of the individuals who have been living in the encampments.

The San Bernardino County Continuum of Care administers the CES and Homeless Management Information System (HMIS) that the City's ERF project will use to assess, prioritize, and place individuals into interim and permanent housing. The CoC will ensure that encampment residents are enrolled in CES, assessed using the VI-SPDAT or successor tool, and matched to available housing resources across the regional system. This alignment ensures that ERF-funded placements are fully integrated with the County's homeless response system.

The San Bernardino County Continuum of Care is committed to the shared goal of providing housing, health, and support services to men, women, and families who are housing insecure. Therefore, we respectfully urge HCD to award ERF Round 5 funding to the City of Ontario for greater paths to safe and stable housing in the region's local communities.

RECOMMENDATION

Receive and approve the Grant Review Committee's recommendation for the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development Fiscal Year 2026 Continuum of Care Program Competition applications for Tier 1 Renewals, Tier 2 Transition Grants, New Continuum of Care Bonus, New Domestic Violence Bonus and the Planning Grant for the following agencies, including their rating, ranking, and tiering, and authorize the Office of Homeless Services to submit the approved and ranked applications with the CoC Consolidated Application to the Department of Housing and Urban Development.

BACKGROUND INFORMATION

The United States Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD) has made available approximately \$4,040,000,000 in funding available for the Fiscal Year (FY) 2026 Continuum of Care (CoC) Continuum of Care Competition, including approximately \$52 million for a Domestic Violence Bonus project and 40% of a CoC's Final Pro Rata Need (FPRN) for the CoC Bonus. In addition, HUD may add to this amount any available funds that have been carried over or recaptured from previous fiscal years.

The HUD FY 2026 CoC Competition and Youth Homelessness Demonstration Program Grants Notice of Funding Opportunity (NOFO), Opportunity No. **CPD-2600-DC-0025** (the "FY 2026 NOFO"), which sets forth new requirements and priorities for DV Bonus, CoC Bonus, Reallocation, Expansion, and Transition Grant projects. The FY 2026 NOFO emphasizes increased competition, reductions in unsheltered homelessness and encampments, treatment and recovery, transitional housing, supportive services, employment and self-sufficiency, public safety coordination, and objective project ranking based on performance and system impact.

All project applications approved by the Grant Review Committee (GRC) as listed on the FY 2026 recommendation are in rank order. CoC Planning is not competitively awarded and therefore not ranked. Higher ranked projects are assigned to Tier 1 and lower ranked projects are assigned to Tier 2 as described in sections V.D.3.a. and b. of the NOFO. This two-tiered approach for CoCs notifies HUD of which projects are prioritized for funding based on local needs and gaps.

- Tier 1 is equal to 60 percent (\$12,123,338) of the CoC's Annual Renewal Demand (ARD) (\$20,205,564) as described in section V.D.3.a. of the NOFO.
 - Project applications in Tier 1 will be conditionally selected from the highest scoring CoC to the lowest scoring CoC, provided the project applications pass both project eligibility and project quality threshold review, and if applicable, project renewal threshold.
 - Any competitively ranked project may be placed in Tier 1 according to the CoC's local rating and ranking process and based on local needs and priorities.
- Tier 2 is the difference between Tier 1 and the sum of each CoC's ARD, CoC Bonus, and DV Bonus.

- HUD will evaluate project applications placed in Tier 2 for project eligibility and project quality threshold requirements and project renewal threshold requirements, if applicable, and will determine funding using the CoC Application score as well as the CoC project ranking.
- HUD will award a point value to each ranked new and renewal project application that is in Tier 2 using a 100-point scale and conditionally select applications in Tier 2 using a point value from the highest scoring project application to the lowest.

Per the approved Grant Inventory Worksheet provided by HUD, the San Bernardino City and County CoC's ARD is \$20,205,564. Tier 1 is equal to 60% of the ARD. Therefore, 40% (\$8,082,225) of the ARD renewal agencies will need to be placed into Tier 2.

On July 22, 2026, the GRC met to approve the Selection of CoC renewal applications, scoring, ranking, and tiering, and prioritization, rating, ranking and tiering of all new project activities concerning new and renewal applications for the CoC Grant application, including the scoring and placement of the 2026 CoC Bonus project.

OHS received a total of 18 applications for the regular CoC Bonus, three application for the DV Bonus and seven applications identified as Transition Grants.

The GRC and OHS are requesting the approval of the following CoC Grant Renewals, Transition Grants, Planning, CoC Bonus, and DV applications for submission through the Collaborative Application to HUD as recommended by the GRC and approved by the CoC Board.

Please note: Pursuant to statute and the program regulations, the CoC Board and HUD retain the ability to revise the funding levels and reallocate funds as needed for the benefit of the CoC.

- The percentage of program stayers/leavers with increased income.
- Permanent housing - rapid rehousing exists to permanent housing destinations.
- Permanent housing – permanent supportive housing exits to permanent housing destinations or retention of permanent housing.

Renewal Scoring are also based on:

Self reported Letter of Intent (LOI) with the following information included:

- Compliance with grants and financial management
- Homeless Management Information System (HMIS) data quality
- Supportive services for participants
- Utilization rates
- Participation in the Coordinated Entry System (CES)
