Powerpoint- Setting Regional Priorities for HHAP 2 (Central Valley Region)	Jessica Alexander/Don Smith	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Slideshow presentation showed the ways HHAP round 2 funding can be prioritized. The goal is to establish/reestablish priorities for HHAP round 2 funding allocated by ICH. Funding designed to address specific and immediate needs related to homelessness in communities. HHAP funds to be for rapid rehousing, new and affordable supportive housing units, emergency shelter, street outreach, service coordination and other services needed to promote housing stability in supportive housing, systems support for activities, delivery of PSH, prevention and shelter diversion including crisis resolution.

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		<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ▪ Funding centered around permanent housing stability ▪ Review of the state's allocation of funds in May 2021 to the County of San Bernardino 5% distributed to each region divided among the regions based on PIT data, 5% to CES, 8% to homeless youth, 7% to admin. ▪ Each region currently is to make project funding recommendations for prioritization. ▪ Goals are set forth in the applications for HHAP 2 funding for the COC. ▪ Data presented on needs and populations being served. 4 strategies within the plan with recommendations to meet the needs- includes system and policy change to address root causes of homelessness, expand homeless prevention and housing programs, create healthy communities for unsheltered individuals, and expand coordination between systems. ▪ RSC Members to rank categories 1-5 Interim Housing/Temporary Shelter, Rental Assistance/Rapid Rehousing, Permanent Housing Plus Services, Diversion and Homeless Prevention, and Outreach and Engagement. ▪ RSC Member will score the categories based on a point break down. Members to determine the eligible uses of HHAP Funds to make priorities in the region.8 eligible uses. ▪ HOPE Team stressed need for funding for more shelters and housing for individuals to go to as the current resources are limited. Need more walk in and night availability. 211 reports provide support that more shelters are needed. ▪ Previous rounds of funds were provided for rental assistance for 55+ individuals, some spent on repairs for housing currently being utilized for target populations, City of Colton used funds for rental assistance and rapid rehousing. ▪ Identified barrier: bottle necking. As low-income families or individuals on fixed income access services they require more long term support as the need for affordable housing/cheaper rent is limited or unattainable. Resources are available for now; however, the same challenges are met months later. ▪ Shared housing is being identified as a promising practice for HHAP funds and to be strongly encouraged
