In September 2007, the San Bernardino County Homeless Partnership (SBCHP) was formed to provide a more focused approach to our goal of ending homelessness within the County. The Partnership consists of city governments, community based organizations, faith-based organizations, educational institutes, non-profit organizations, private industry, and federal, state, and local government.


SBCHP was developed to promote a strong collaboration between agencies to direct the planning, development, and implementation of the County's 10-year-plan to end chronic homelessness. The Partnership meets on the third Wednesday of each month at the Behavioral Health Resource Center in Rialto. The Partnership facilitates better communication, planning, coordination, and cooperation among all entities that provide services and/or resources for the relief of homelessness in San Bernardino County.

The Mission of the San Bernardino County Homeless Partnership is to provide a system of care that is inclusive, well planned, coordinated and evaluated and is accessible to all who are homeless and those at-risk of becoming homeless.





They have been working with at-risk homeless individuals since 2009. VVFRC also collaborates with six other agencies in the region. Their vision is “A World Where Everyone is Healthy and Housed.” ● Some of the services they provide are: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ▪ Transitional Housing <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ○ Azalea Springs - Housing for 12 people in a 4 bedroom home ○ Hollister – Housing for 14 AB109 men ▪ Education <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ○ Online GED ○ Introduction to Computers ▪ Utility Assistance (gas and electric) by working with Community Action Partnership ▪ Food Baskets ▪ Work Readiness program through Workforce Investment Board <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ○ Computer lab in each house ▪ Community Service and Volunteer Opportunities through United Way ▪ Financial Literacy via a relationship with Wells Fargo <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ○ Help them with researching rentals so they can plan for their future ● The future involves expanding their housing services and wrap- around services to fill in the gaps of services, as well as those services which are a low priority of other agencies. They also currently work with diversion and are looking at other options to assist those in need. An example is to call another agency to see if they can help provide shelter instead of using a motel voucher.
