Attendees included representatives from Children’s Society, the Department of Homeless Services, Job Corps, and Operation Grace. Angel Magallanes, the guest presenter, introduced herself and her role.</p> <p>There was total of 12 public attendees who joined the HYTF meeting in person, and 1 individual joined via Zoom and/or telephoned in.</p>

Introduction to Homeless Youth Task Force	Tyrese Crawford, Chair	<p>Tyrese Crawford:</p> <p>Tyrese Crawford welcomed attendees and thanked the group for their patience. She noted that the team conducted outreach in Barstow earlier in the day and shared his prior experience working in the South Bay area.</p>
Receive presentation on Coalition Against Sexual Exploitation (C.A.S.E.)	Angel Magallanes, Coordinator for the Coalition Against Sexual Exploitation (C.A.S.E.) in the County of San Bernardino	<p>Angel Magallanes:</p> <p>C.A.S.E coordinator, Magallanes conducts outreach efforts and meetings to raise awareness about human trafficking in San Bernardino County. Magallanes actively participates in community events, working to address the issue.</p> <p>C.A.S.E. Program Overview:</p> <p><u>Background</u></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • The C.A.S.E. (Child Abuse Services Team) program was established in 2009 in collaboration with the District Attorney’s Office. • The program serves system-involved minors impacted by sexual exploitation, with a focus on protection, advocacy, and trauma-informed care. • Services include direct support to youth, as well as community education and professional consultation. <p><u>Legal Context</u></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • A 2017 legislative change decriminalized minors for prostitution-related offenses, shifting the approach to victim-centered care. <p><u>Services and Programming</u></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Utilizes a Multidisciplinary Team (MDT) model with monthly meetings including the Public Defender’s Office, Children and Family Services, Sheriff’s Department, CASA, and other partners. • Maintains an active caseload of approximately 25–45 youth. • Provides individualized, case-specific service planning. • Conducts ongoing outreach, community engagement, and resource navigation.

Educational Offerings

- Provides Human Trafficking 101 trainings (approximately 2 hours, free of charge).
- Delivers healthy relationship presentations for middle and high school students.
- Facilitates activities such as the “Empowerment Buddy” program to promote coping skills and connection.
- Applies a harm reduction model and addresses complex trauma through a multidisciplinary approach.

Community Engagement and Events

- Hosts quarterly outreach and vendor events.
- Coordinates an annual symposium held in January; workshop proposals are currently being accepted.

Upcoming Events

- April 1, 2026 – Virtual Outreach & Education Meeting (10:00 AM – 12:00 PM, via Zoom)
- Month of April – Child Abuse Prevention Month (Shine a Light Breakfast)
- May 1, 2026 – Human Trafficking Awareness Walk (nationwide event)

Program Impact

- Currently serving over 60 active clients, with more than 700 cumulative service interactions.
- Provides ongoing consultation to law enforcement, probation, county school staff, case managers, attorneys, and partner agencies.

Discussion Following Presentation

- A question was raised regarding the prevalence of male victims in trafficking and exploitation cases.
- It was noted that exploitation affects individuals of all genders; however, male victimization is often underreported.
- Emphasis was placed on the importance of providing safe, nonjudgmental spaces, including for individuals who may return to exploitative environments.
- Programs such as Open Door were identified as providing supportive environments.
- CASA supports youth involved in the court system; alternative services are utilized when CASA is unavailable.
- The importance of peer support programs and consistent mentorship was highlighted.
