PUBLIC COMMENT
(Wendell): The Mountain Homeless Coalition is organizing a "Spread the Warmth" ent on November 13th at noon in Big Bear and Lake Arrowhead, offering free lunch id discussing the coalition's history and services. It is the meeting discussed updates on homelessness initiatives, including a kiosk nectionality beta test and a new dashboard for tracking results of point-in-time counts. Endell highlighted the importance of meeting state standards for homelessness anding, noting that previous efforts only met one out of three to four requirements.  Paul: The meeting discussed changes to the Continuum of Care and Office of meless Services procedures, including the differentiation between steering mittee and provider network meetings. The September COC full membership reting included a legislative report and discussion of self-service kiosks being talled in various county locations. Paul presented visual dashboards for tracking a performance measures and compared data across different Continuums of Care. The group discussed challenges with the 2-1-1 hotline system and praised the nuntain Homeless Coalition for their responsive service. Paul shared information but a new collaborative initiative focused on aging populations and homelessness, luding potential uses of Al and technology in case conferencing.  Becky: Becky discussed the impact of federal budget cuts on nonprofit funding, ting that the EFSP grant through FEMA was frozen and no new applications are ing accepted. She mentioned receiving a \$50,000 donation from San Manuel and hilighted the region's efficient use of funds. Wendell and Becky discussed the certainty of federal funding for the next two years, with Wendell emphasizing the tental for substantial reductions in HUD and other programs affecting low-income inviduals. The group also touched on the closure of a rural hospital in Big Bear and expected the program of the program and t

		Collaborative's upcoming sign-ups for Thanksgiving and Christmas assistance, noting an increased need for food, clothing, and utility assistance this year.	
		5. Sue W.: Sue Walker provided details on the January 2025 point-in-time count, which had similar results to the previous year, with Big Bear's numbers being adjusted after additional counting. The group also touched on the need for better organization of future point-in-time counts to improve funding percentages.

# Statement of Content for this Month's Presentation Portion of the Mountain Regional Steering Committee for November 10, 2025

Without a Power Point Presentation this month, the following is a summation of our Mountains RSC - November Presenter's (I.e., Kathy Estes')

The "Culture of Poverty" training offers a transformative look into the unseen rules, values, and survival strategies that shape life in economically disadvantaged communities. Based on the groundbreaking work of Dr. Ruby Payne and brought to life through powerful stories, this training invites participants to understand poverty not as a personal failure, but as a complex cultural system rooted in relationships, survival, and resilience. Attendees learn how differences in language, thought patterns, and motivation affect behavior—and how schools, agencies, and service providers can better connect across class lines by building trust and adapting communication.
