2. Morongo Basin ARCH was incorporated on February 6, 2008, and reinstated with the IRS on April 13, 2017, when the board changed.

3. Morongo Basin ARCH does not have any commitments or potential commitments that may impact the Applicant's ability to perform the Contract if awarded to us.

#### **Statement of Experience and Qualifications**

Morongo Basin ARCH was established to Align Resources and Challenge Homelessness in the Morongo Basin. The current board is continuing this Mission Statement by running five programs that address homelessness. Since 2017 we have had two emergency shelters/transitional homes that serve single men and women. In 2019 we added a duplex to house homeless families with children. In 2022 we added a duplex in Yucca Valley for additional emergency shelter. The fifth program is a Home Key program with the City of Twentynine Palms for Veterans. It is a supportive permanent housing opening this Spring. Lastly, we have a staffed office for client intake/Triage and case management in Joshua Tree.

ARCH staff has administered the reporting of County grants since 2019. We have completed the HEAP grant. We have almost completed HHAP 1 and are currently using HHAP 2 funding. We are compliant with HMIS reporting for all the grant funding we are using and CES.

In 2022 we served 31 clients in the Emergency Shelter program, 7 clients in Eviction Prevention, 7 clients in Rapid-Rehousing, and identified and served 7 in Street Outreach. This year we have already served or are serving 47 clients in our Emergency Shelter program alone. We currently are assisting clients with Eviction Prevention cases and Rapid-Rehousing costs.

#### D. Project Description

This project is the third in a series of HHAP funding being used to support Morongo Basin ARCH Housing Programs in the East Valley. The primary purpose of these programs is to maintain or place into housing at-risk or homeless clients. These four programs are Street Outreach, Emergency Sheltering, Rapid Rehousing and Eviction Prevention. All four programs are used to move a client into housing stability. The at-risk client or homeless client begins with a phone call for help or, in street outreach, an offer to help. Triage begins with an intake and discussion of a plan to address the barriers to stable housing in our Navigation Center office. Funds for the Navigation Center will be used for operating expenses. Bridging in an ARCH home or a short motel stay uses Emergency Shelter funds to house clients while waiting to enter the located affordable housing in the Rapid Rehousing Program. Clients that are at-risk of becoming homeless are helped through our funds in the Eviction Prevention Program.

We serve all adult individuals from 18 years old and up, couples and families.

To help meet:

- 1) New units of permanent supportive housing and/or service enriched housing will be occupied by June 2024

A) Morongo Basin ARCH has partnered with the City of Twentynine Palms in a VASH vouchers Home Key project. Veterans will have a VA caseworker but will also have a caseworker from Morongo Basin ARCH if needed to support long term stability. It is anticipated that we will not need to use HHAP 3 funds for a caseworker.

- 2) Households will exit homelessness and achieve permanent housing stability through rapid rehousing activities. These are:

A) Emergency sheltering in a motel, our Fortuna Home, Cactus Home, Encelia Home or our Center Street Duplex Family Program.

B) Evaluate barriers and address immediate needs such as food, clothing, transportation, employment, services available, and mentoring and monitoring steps in achieving stability.

C) Navigation of local available affordable housing and other housing outside of area

D) Payment of deposits, first month, application fees, storage and moving fees

E) A case worker and case management is part of this program.

- 3) Additional shelter/interim housing beds will be occupied.

A) Morongo Basin ARCH currently has 9 beds for individual men, 6 beds for individual women and two units for homeless families with children.

B) We refer TAY age youth, seniors, probation and parolees to another nonprofit in our area when we do not have housing.

C) A case worker and house managers are part of this program.

4) Households living housing insecure and/or at-risk of homelessness will be prevented from becoming homeless through systemwide diversion and prevention strategies

A) Insecure households will be supported by meeting problems such as food scarcity, utility payments, working with the school district to keep children at school, transportation, and counseling on how to prevent future insecurities.

B) A case worker and case manager are part of this program.

5) Households of imminent risk of homelessness will be prevented from becoming homeless with eviction prevention strategies

A) Funding will be available to help pay arrears and delinquent utilities payments

B) Negotiate with owner on repayment options.

C) A case worker and case manager are part of this program.

6) High individual or family utilizers of safety net services and experiencing chronic homelessness will achieve permanent housing stability

A) Population with chronic homelessness because of severe barriers such as chronic addiction and or untreated mental health will be monitored in street outreach by establishing rapport through meeting basic needs such as meals, clothing, hygiene products and services, and transportation.

B) Emergency shelter will be available once stability is desired, and bridging can occur.

C) Effort to place in a transitional housing program that will support barrier reduction leading to a more successful effort to find a supportive housing program or qualify for a rental or home through Rapid-Rehousing.

D) A case worker and case management are part of this program.

## **E. Work Plan and Schedule/Project Readiness**

### **Work Plan**

These funds will be placed in accounts for the approved HHAP 3 categories. They will be immediately used for clients, caseworkers and for necessary operating expenses for the projects and the Navigation Center where the office is located for client interaction.

### **Schedule**

When the funds are available for withdrawal, half the funds will be withdrawn to begin or continue giving services to clients. I am anticipating funds available early in 2024. The remaining balance, which will be half the remaining funds, will be withdrawn when needed. This may be at the end of 2024.

## **F. Long Term Results**

Morongo Basin ARCH will be able to continue to fund our four main programs which are Street Outreach, Emergency Shelter/Navigation Centers, Eviction Prevention and Rapid Rehousing. An additional program is supportive veteran housing with the City of Twentynine Palms, the Home Key Elm Project. This project should be self-funded.

Street Outreach is the foundation for a successful off the street program. Funds for Street Outreach will be used to support our street outreach workers, funds for food, clothing, hygiene products, sleeping bags and bus or gas cards. Our street outreach workers have established an excellent rapport with the homeless and have helped us identify them and their needs. We have been able to more accurately identify the actual number of homeless in the Morongo Basin through our Street Outreach Program. An example was the inaccurate counts in our local city and town until street outreach workers were able to connect with homeless not easily found. With these funds we can begin providing more services to the homeless through Morongo Basin ARCH or through other programs that are available through the COC. A strong street outreach program is important to begin to systematically identify those homeless individuals, couples and families that can be successfully moved into emergency shelter for rapid rehousing. If they are not ready, then they are identified, and relationship building is developed until they are ready to address barriers thwarting efforts for housing.

The second program that follows care services is emergency sheltering for homeless individuals, couples and families. Morongo Basin ARCH has five homes for emergency sheltering. They are for individuals and families with children. We can house 9 men, 3 women and 2 families in our shelter homes. We also bridge individuals, couples and families in motels while waiting to enter permanent housing. Funds are used for motel rooms, rental fees, utility payments and caseworkers. The result of these funds is to reduce the homeless that are unhoused, support them in shelters, (bridging), until they can move into permanent housing.

The third program is permanent housing. The main program we offer is Rapid Rehousing. These funds cover deposits, first month rent, application fees, move-in fees, etc. We also look for other available programs that offer these same services and partner with them. Permanent housing is the final goal of our housing program. Funding for Rapid Rehousing is needed to ensure that individuals, couples and families can quickly get housed.

The fourth necessary program is the prevention of homelessness with funds to address potential evictions. Funds are used to help with payments of arrears or utilities. Caseworkers also provide other important information on programs available for more assistance with utility plans. They also coach for better budgeting of funds. These funds are important to prevent homelessness, especially for families. In addition, funding can be used to monitor housing stability by a caseworker.

### **G. Project Sustainability**

The services being provided by Morongo Basin ARCH are mainly being sustained through HHAP funding. Additional funding is coming through other grants and donations. The grants and donations are from the City of Twentynine Palms, Measure Y from the Town of Yucca Valley and smaller donations from service groups. Without the HHAP funding, community donations and grants, Morongo Basin ARCH would not be able to run this extensive homeless prevention program.

### **H. Collaboration**

Morongo Basin ARCH is fortunate that we have strong community support for our programs. The City of Twentynine Palms is our partner in the Veteran Program Home Key project. They have also funded our operating expenses and emergency shelter projects in extreme weather. We have received grants from the Town of Yucca Valley to support our Street Outreach program. We are supported by church groups and the Rotaries of our area for food donations. Other groups who have donated funding are the Sportsman Center and the Military Wives from our local Marine Corps base. We deeply appreciate the collaboration and support the Morongo Basin extends to Morongo Basin ARCH.

### **J. Coordinated Entry System (CES)**

Morongo Basin ARCH's programs are part of the County's Coordinated Entry System. Clients are encouraged to call 211 for initial help. Once they are accepted into a program, they are entered into HMIS. Clients that need services outside of our area are again referred to 211 for further assistance especially for supportive housing programs.

### **K. Homeless Management Information System (HMIS)**

Morongo Basin ARCH is part of HMIS. All our clients that receive services funded by a HHAP or ESG grant are entered into the HMIS system.

## L. Measurable Outcomes

The indicators that the proposed project is successful at resolving homelessness are as follow:

**Street Outreach** – the goal is to successfully identify all the homeless in the Morongo Basin. This was partially achieved through the extended period of the Point in Time Count this year when more homeless were identified throughout the basin. The goal is to continue to identify homeless individuals and families in areas not well covered in the Count. The current number is over 200 unsheltered, mostly in the city and towns in the area. We believe there is much more. Through our staff and partners, we will continue to identify and triage the homeless to link with services.

**Emergency Shelter/Navigation Center** –The goal is to use funding to bridge more individuals and families in motels, in one of our homes, or in another program that offers Emergency Sheltering. Emergency Sheltering funds were also used for extreme cold weather sheltering this early Spring. Our goal is to increase funding to help individuals and homeless families stay bridged either with our funding or with another qualifying nonprofit bridging program. Our goal is to increase the number of clients in bridged housing to match the increase in homeless identified in this year's Point in Time Count by at least **25 more clients or families in motels or in one of our homes** by using the available funds in the Emergency Shelter Category.

The Navigation Center operating expenses are attached to the Emergency Shelter category. These expenses, which are utilities and office expenses, are usually a consistent monthly expense. This office center is critical because it is the basis of operations as a call center and for case manager/client interactions.

**Eviction/Homeless Prevention** – The goal is to be able to assist more clients in need of paying arrears to stay housed with these funds. These funds will **cover 13 clients with a limit of up to \$2000** in assistance. Last year we helped 7 households. This year we have helped 2 families. We will be able to help more by limiting the assistance.

**Rapid-Rehousing** – The goal is to be able to assist more clients in need of assistance in paying deposits, first month rent, application fees, storage fees, etc. Last year we helped 7 households. We will use the funds to help 13 households with a limit of \$2000 in assistance. Last year we helped 7 households. This year we have already helped 3 families.

## M. Administrative Capacity

Morongo Basin ARCH has received three other grants from the County that require monthly reporting. Caseworkers and the office staff turn in all required receipts and paperwork for clients that are required for the reporting. The Expenditure Report, HMIS report and supporting client documents and receipts are in turn sent to the County in a monthly report by the case manager who is responsible for grant reporting.
